Step 3: Sort the remaining plates into the correct hoop.

Step 4: After all the plates are sorted, read all the words in each hoop – see how fast you can read them!

This is a great activity for busy kids. Play outside and hide the plates around the yard.

RHYMING EGG SPIN

Step 1: Take an egg.

Step 4: Return the egg to the basket.
