- <u>Spirit of Caring</u> This position is responsible for organizing cards and/or gifts for staff who have had major life events. Time commitment is minimal.


1. Sign up for Zoom.us simply by going to "zoom.us"

- 2. Click "Join a Meeting" on the top right of the page, type in the meeting ID: 785-440-4092 and then click "Join."
- 3. Install "Zoom.us" on your computer If you opt to join a meeting on your cell phone or tablet please be aware that it will use a fair amount of data. Therefore, we recommend that you join by Wi-Fi or on your home computer. If you have problems downloading and installing Zoom, please follow the steps site.

4. After installation, Run Zoom. You should have a screen pop up that looks like this...



- A. Enter the 785-440-4092 in the box that requests your "Meeting ID"
- B. Input the name that will be seen by everyone that joins the meeting. Example name is shown.
- C. Click "Join"
- 5. Once you enter the meeting, you should now have a screen that looks like this...



- A. Click "Join Audio Conference by Computer"
- B. You will now have the conference call screen in front of you. Once the meeting starts the main screen will be of the Parent Council Meeting at the School with participants pictures in smaller boxes.
- 6. To allow everyone to hear what is happening in the Learning Commons during our meetings we are asking that everyone "Mute" their audio. This can be done by...




- A. Going to the bottom of your screen and clicking on the microphone on the far-left side. Once you click on the microphone it should look as pictured above.
- B. If you have any questions or comments during the meeting please use the "Chat" button to type them and we will be monitoring the questions and comments as they come in and we will answer them as quickly as we can.
