#### **AGENDA**

#### A. Welcome

#### Tina Andiel Carlson / Naomi Shumka

Tina Andiel Carlson welcomed everyone.

#### B. Approval of Agenda

#### C. Approval of Nov 2019 Meeting Minutes

#### D. Update from Springbank Community Association

**Karin Hunter** 

Karin provided an update on the proposed community centre which will be located with the Middle School. MD or Rocky View has committed funds to initiate the build, but the intention is that it is also partially funded by the community. This facility would include a large size gymnasium and a space for Cottage Care. This facility will eliminate the requirement to communicate for indoor sports as right now all games for the kids who participate in these sports are away games.

It is estimated the total cost of the building will be between \$5M - \$7M (approximately). The next steps is to initiate a survey to the parents to gauge the importance of the facility and start to initiate the process of bridging the gap from a funding perspective. There will be a requirement for sponsors and fundraising events to complete the build.

The facility will also provide the opportunity to partner with sport class providers and offer various sports via memberships or drop in rates. It also provides the opportunity to offer after school programs. The build of the facility will coincide with the re-work of roads/access around that area with a new side road being built allowing access to Callaway Park.

The planned survey will be sent to all parents who have children at the school.

#### E. School Trustee Report

Springbank High School recently competed in their first robotics competition which included 33 teams from around the province. Springbank High School came in second. The competition included a business presentation on what they needed for the robot, a design of the robot which would solve a problem, fabrication of the robot and software/programming of the robot. The winners will receive early admission to engineering programs at University.

Dr. Devra Davis sounds the alarm regarding Cell Phone Radiation

This link is to the lecture given by Dr. Devra Davis regarding the health effects of mobile phones and wireless radiation. Although the video is long, the information presented is valuable.

In this lecture, epidemiologist and electromagnetic radiation expert, Dr Devra Davis, outlines the evolution of the mobile phone and smartphone, and provides a background to the current 19-year-old radiation-safety standards (SAR), policy developments and international legislation. She presents new global studies on the health consequences of mobile/wireless radiation including children's exposure and risks.

Risks related to sperm production and mobility are well documented.

3D images of children using a cell phone shows the radiation covering the child's face.

In 2011 the World Health Organization gave a warning that cell phone radiation exposure is carcinogenic.

Cell phones are kept away from the body, ipads are not used on laps and that headsets are used.

She warns parent to safeguard their children by ensuring that

- Cell phones are not kept in your pocket or on your person.
- Ipads are not used on laps
- Devices are kept on airplane mode when not in use to reduce the pulsing impact which generates the greatest radiation.
- Devices are kept out of the bedroom
- Use ear phones
- · Limit the length and number of calls
- Use phones in areas of good reception
- Educate your children about the risks

Rocky View Schools has been approved for 2 new portables (27 were asked for) and 7 moves of existing portables.

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The Alberta government has released the budget and set out the following parameters for K-12 funding.

The following is an excerpt from Education Minister LaGrange's budget speech:

"We are introducing a new way to fund Alberta's education system that will drive more dollars to the classroom, where they can enable school authorities to deliver the best outcomes for our students. The new model will deliver more efficient and sustainable funding to the Kindergarten to Grade 12 education system to ensure all schools in Alberta have adequate resources to deliver programs in an equitable way. This new model reduces red tape and administrative costs by reducing the number of funding envelopes, while maintaining the overall funding level and giving school authorities more autonomy and flexibility to invest in classrooms based on their students' needs. A predictable funding model will also allow school authorities to do better long-term planning by making more informed budget decisions well ahead of the start of a school year.

For the first time ever, school authorities will be provided with funding commitment letters in spring 2020 for the upcoming school year to support effective planning of service delivery to our students."

Rockyview administration and Trustees are presently reviewing the budget information received:

	Given the provincial budget flows dollars to school boards through a new funding model with a different grant structure, it will take time for our administration to determine the impact of the budget on Rocky View Schools.
