Fire Processes and Safety Presentation

- Interior "attack" for a fire cannot happen until second truck arrives. Currently second truck is coming from Cochrane.
- Currently looking at a automated response from all surrounding areas, Calgary, Airdrie, Cochrane etc... One is currently in place with Chestermere.
- Goal at the end of the day for Rocky View county (Schools, community center, homes...) to have the closest available people to arrive on scene whether it be a fire or motor vehicle accident, no matter what jurisdiction the resources are in.

Randy Smith Rocky View Fire Chief

- Rocky View has good support from council.
- Moving toward regional fire service. Cochrane, Crosswood, Chestermere and Redwood and Rocky View have an agreements in place that does not "have borders" when calls are placed.
- Rocky View has been working with Calgary and hopefully will continue to work towards an agreement.
- Trucks now have computers with GPS in the trucks so dispatch can see where the trucks are at.
