These items are labeled per student and packed per class which is how Subway provides their food to us now. They also have chicken noodle soup and chilli (gluten free) which come to the school in large containers which are then portioned out and served using parent volunteers. • RVS Ward Boundary Review.

Just a reminder that RVS ward boundaries will be changing. The Board voted on the bylaw that will see a change in RVS wards. Due to growth in Chestermere, Airdrie, and Cochrane the dynamics in RVS has changed. The Board has approved a plan to add one trustee (total 8)

1 in rural SE, 1 in Chestermere, 1 in rural NE, 3 Airdrie, 1 Cochrane, and 1 in West RVS. Ward 4 and 5 to be combined. (SMS, SCHS, EEVE, Banded Peak, Bearspaw and Westbrook) More info on RVS website.

• 2017 School Board Elections

Elections will be held on Monday, October 16. Nomination day is 4 weeks prior to election day which will be be Monday, Sept. 18. . More information is available on the ASBA (Alberta School Boards Association) website.

Provincial Budget

Tabled March 16 which included growth funding and funding for 10 new schools. The government has committed to a 25% reduction in school fees. Boards are anxiously waiting to see how the shortage will be covered. Transportation is already a challenge impacted by the carbon tax.

When you compare instruction and administration funding per student, RVS is one of the lowest funded divisions in the province. The current funding formula has to be revised. The base funding needs to rise through the

reduction/elimination/adjustment of targeted grants, that create winners and losers. Boards need more autonomy in deciding where funding provided needs to be allocated. The growth funding should be a given as every child needs to be funded. If Bill 1 is passed RVS will receive funding to offset the elimination of instructional resource fees and school bus fees for those living 2.4 km or greater from their designated school. This funding is based on 2015/16 enrolment numbers. We have increased by 2,200 students meaning that the jurisdiction will have to find about \$254,000. We will also be faced with additional costs for the carbon levy for natural gas of \$165,000 and bus diesel fuel of \$300,000

For the 2017/18 school year the board has identified its priorities. These will guide the budget process and direct expenditures. The Board has directed that the emphasis be on the following priorities:

- Direct classroom supports to enhance student achievement
- School-based services for inclusive learning environments
- Specialized and wrap-around services for students with complex & emotional needs
- Literacy, numeracy, and 21st C skills and knowledge

• RVS 2018-2020 Capital Plan

Every April school boards submit an updated capital plan. Since there have been no new school approvals since October 2015 RVS is once again in critical need of space. The capital plan was approved on March 16. Once again due to the increased growth and need for student learning spaces the need for new spaces impacts modernizations.

Rocky View Schools continues to experience large student population growth, over 5 percent annually or 1000+ students. This is equivalent to the capacity of two schools (approx. 600 students/school) each year.

Airdrie will require a new school every year. Cochrane area will need a new school every 2-3 years. Chestermere area will need a new school every 2-3 years. +250 students annually = 1 school every 2-3 years

Even with the Mar. 21, 2017, announcement of a new school to open in Airdrie's Hillcrest community, by September 2020, RVS utilization rate will be 95 percent.

•If no new capacity is added to RVS, then the utilization rate increases by 4.5 percent every year and by 2022 the jurisdiction will be at 103 percent capacity.

Change in 2017/18 School Calendar

Due to Alberta Education changing the exam dates the Board of Trustees approved a changed to the 2017/18 calendar. 1st day of second semester is changed to Wednesday January 31, 2018. Last day of school for HS students is now Thursday, June 28, 2018.

The last day for schools with kindergarten to Grade 9 remain unchanged as Wednesday June 27, 2018. June 28 and June 29 remain as organizational days.

Background.

In January 2017 RVS administration became aware of the fact that Alberta Education had changed the dates for Diploma Examinations for the January 2018 and June 2018 writing periods. The last day of exams for the January 2018 writing period is now Tuesday, January 2018 which would mean the first day of the second semester would change to Wednesday, January 31, 2018. The last day of exams for the June 2018 writing period is now Thursday, June 28, 2018.

Schools with high school students will need to have Thursday, June 28, 2018 as the last Instructional Day in order for students in Grade 12 to be able to participate in Diploma Examinations. Friday, June 29, 2018 would remain an Organization Day. The last day of classes for schools with Kindergarten to Grade 9 will remain as Wednesday, June 27, 2018 with Thursday, June 28, 2018 and Friday, June 29, 2018 as

We will miss her but wish her all the best in her new role.

• RVS meeting with Minister Eggen

Members of the Board of Trustees will be meeting with Minister Eggen on Friday April 7, 2017. On the agenda from the Minister is Education Act, Curriculum Redesign and Climate Change initiatives. RVS hopes to talk about funding, infrastructure needs, and the Ward Boundary recommendations.

Although many at EVE would not know Carmen Harford, I would also like to express my condolences to her family and friends on her passing. Carmen taught at SMS and was a staff member at Banded Peak. I had the pleasure to work with Carmen both as a parent and school trustee. She was an amazing teacher who not only had impact on her students, but on her colleagues and everyone who knew her.
