8. Yearbook Committee Brenda Renowden

- We have sold about 250 books to date. We are aiming for 276. We are further ahead than previous years, so paying through school cash online seems to be successful. All other items are progressing as scheduled.

9. French Immersion/CPF Lori Champagne

- CPF conducted a profitable fundraiser to support French activities in the Springbank schools. We have earmarked \$650 for Elbow Valley, to be disbursed for supplies or events as decided by the FI teachers.

10. Long-Term Planning Committee Frankie-Lou Nelligan

- Assessing the pilot projects from last year – indoor gardens and white boards
- Mathletics was set-up for the school

12. FEEVES Monica Webster

13. Other – Bok Presentation

- BOKS promotes the powerful impact that physical activity has on a child's mind, body and community. The program prepares children for a day of learning by getting them to be physically active before their school day starts. BOKS was inspired by the book, *Spark*, by Dr. John Ratey of Harvard Medical School. Several studies establish that moderate to vigorous physical activity stimulates brain function and creates the physiological conditions for students to be ready to learn. "
- BOKS is coming to EVE Wednesday Morning, 755-840 am, Starting March 1
- Looking for kids to sign up for 12 weeks
- Need volunteers to cover a 1:10 ratio (TBD)
- Have 3 people confirmed, need a few more
- Discussion points - how many kids?
- Approval for \$50 for extra supplies

F. School Trustee Report

Helen Clease

- **Budget Priorities and Timelines**
 - The Board of Trustees at their January 26th meeting will begin to develop budget priorities and review timelines in preparation for the provincial budget to be released sometime in March. From all accounts this will once again be a challenging budget with concerns about it being more directive with less flexibility and autonomy to meet local needs. One bit of good news we are hearing is that enrolment growth will meet local needs. One bit of good news we are hearing is that enrolment growth will at least be funded.
- **Administration of PAT and Diploma Exams**
 - A change to the administration of all future Grade 6 and 9 Provincial Achievement tests is to introduce more flexibility. Beginning in the 2017/2018 school year Grade 6 and 9 PAT's will be administered to students during an administration window specified by Alberta Education rather than a pre-set single date and time for each exam. Jurisdiction will have the flexibility to schedule within that window. For the 2017/2018 school year the window is as follows:
 - Grade 9 (written responses) January 17-23, 2018
 - Grade 9 (multiple choice) January 24-31, 2018
 - Grade 6 & 9 (written response) May 7 – 11, 2018
 - Grade 6 & 9 (multiple choice) June 11 – 28, 2018
- **RVS Ward Boundary Review**
 - The board has reviewed feedback from our online survey and is now moving forward to determine what options must be considered. Due to unprecedented growth in Chestermere, Airdrie and Cochrane the dynamics in RVS has changed. More info on RVS website.
- **Alberta Electoral Boundary Review**
 - Boards have been asked to prepare a written submission or a present at one of the public hearings. This is to review the boundaries and the names of the 87 electoral constituencies in the province. The final report from the commission will be submitted to the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly this fall.
- **Transportation Policy 17 Revised**
 - This policy came to the board on Jan 26th for second read. The Board believes that providing safe transportation of our students is a shared responsibility of the Board, bus contractors, parents and students. This work was to update and reaffirm the policy. Two guidelines that were no longer applicable were removed along with some minor working changes.
- **Alberta School Councils Association Conference**

- ASCA's yearly conference will be held in Edmonton at the end of April. ASCA provides council members with opportunities to network and to attend many PD opportunities. More info on ASCA's website.
- **Prime Minister's Awards (nomination deadline extended)**
 - This award is to honour amazing teachers or early childhood educators. This is a great opportunity to show a special teacher how much you appreciate what they do. Info can be found on the Prime Ministers Awards or RVS website
- **Provincial News**
 - Wildrose Education Critic – now Leela Aheer, formerly Mark Smith
 - Danielle Larivee is no longer Municipal Affairs Minister. Shaye Anderson has taken over. Boards have been working closely with Minister Larivee on the Municipal Government Act. We feel we have made some advances but are concerned about The City of Charter aspect, which could have serious impact on Board autonomy.
 - Education Act future still uncertain. School Act continues to be in place.
 - Provincial Budget to be released in March.
- **Saskatchewan Governance Report**
 - Once again trusteeship is in the news as in an effort to reduce costs the Sask government is considering the following: Amalgamation of boards under 500 students, amalgamation of boards new large urban centres, appointed trustees or possibly a central or regional model similar to Alberta's.
- On a personal note I would like to inform you that I have stepped back from my provincial duties. That being said I will continue to work within my community and with RVS as your trustee
