- May has been a great month of celebration. Musicfest was a great show with our students singing and dancing like pros. And our Volunteer Tea had a nice turn out.
- School Education Plan and Budget has been submitted and we should see them on the website by the fall.
- Homeroom teachers are allocated from a central Allocation formula and we have been 6 Kindergarten classes of about 20 students each and 20 Gr. 1-4 homeroom classes. The largest classes are in Gr.4 with 30 students per class. These numbers may change in the fall, but additional teachers will not be allocated until then.
- We are able to maintain the support we presently have in terms of assistant time.
- Class lists have been finalized and this information will be sent out by mid June.
- June also brings the final Fire Drill (we hold 6 per year), Gr. 4 Talent Show, Calaway Park and Tug o War. K graduation and new K orientation. Several field trips, including rewarding our Friendly Helpers with a trip to the Wave Pool.
