D. School Trustee Report

- a. It has been a busy month despite including a Spring Break. The Board through its consultation process has found a way to find the one million dollars to manage the expected transportation shortfall. While the decision will have impact, the Board hopes that the impact will be the least intrusive for families. While the Board has made changes, administration has been asked to continue to look for further cost savings.
- **b.** The Department of Education has received feedback from all parts of the province in this regard and is now initiating its own parent consultation. The process however is not expected to conclude prior to the fall of 2018, so changes, if made, will occur in the 2019-2020 school year
- c. I attended the annual School Councils Conference that was held in Edmonton, April 20-22. The conference was sold out! And no wonder, the sessions were pertinent and varied. Minister Eggen opened the conference with a speech outlining the highlights of the Department of Education's work. After the speech he answered questions for about 45 minutes. The Keynote speaker, Dr.Lynn Miller, was outstanding. Her speech, entitled "Mental Health Matters" spoke about the emerging mental health concerns of children and youth as an urgent Canadian Health problem. In addition, there was plenty of interaction with colleagues from across the province as well as a resource fair. It was certainly a conference I will attend again and would encourage school councils to send a representative.
- d. Trustees met with the Town of Crossfield, the Town of Cochrane and City of Chestermere with end to understanding issues that are pertinent to all parties. The Board is very concerned about not receiving approval for any new schools in this last round of funding announcements. In order to be considered at all for a school the school-site needs to be ready. That means the land needs to be levelled and services in place which is the responsibility of our municipal partners. With our population growth at over 5% per year, Rockyview needs to build at

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- least two schools each year. With no construction approvals this round, our communities will experience an accommodation crisis by 2021.
- e. I attended the documentary "Screenagers" hosted by the Springbank schools It was an excellent film informing parents regarding the research on the use of technology and issues that parents should know. You can google "Screenagers" to get the website.
- f. This past weekend I attended a wonderful Spring Fair at Westbrook School. The event involved displays of student art, horticultural, handicrafts, science projects, baking and included a pet show in the front yard of the school. Parents offered a home-made lunch at family-friendly prices. The Fair was fabulous example of how schools are integrally linked to communities.
