4. Teachers' Report Trish Cull

- No report this month

5. Volunteer Coordinators Sally Lockhart/Michelle Adams

- Transitioning the grade 1 lunchroom supervisor so the volunteer coordinator role will take that on.
- Hot dog lunch – will send out a call for volunteers mid June via Sign-Up Genius. Will ask Rotary Club to supply the bbq

6. Special Lunch Coordinator Tannis Bo

- Based on last month's meeting, I spoke to the Lunch Coordinator at the middle school and found out that the reason that they did not continue with Wok Box and Chopped was that there wasn't enough interest at the middle school. Both vendors were professional to deal with and the food was good.
- I went through the list of vendors available to us and reached out to two of them, Mucho Burrito and Via Cibo.
- Mucho Burrito has chicken, pork, veggie and beef burritos as well as a GF chicken burrito that we would probably sell for \$6.00. They also have a kid's cheese quesadilla that would most likely sell for \$5.25 and a kid's chicken quesadilla that would probably go for \$5.50. The orders would come labeled per student and sorted per class but would need someone to deliver them to the classes.
- Via Cibo has various pasta and panini options, including GF pasta. The prices are a bit higher so we would probably sell the non-meat pasta and the Panini's for \$6.50 and the pastas with meat for \$8.50 - \$9.50. The lunch would come labeled with the student's name, grade and teacher and volunteers would be needed to sort the lunches out and deliver them.
- Other vendors are available but I didn't consider them if I thought the food might be too messy for our younger students or if it was similar to something we already have.
- I have reviewed the calendar next year and if approved by Lindsay, we would have 33 Fridays that we could offer special lunch. If we choose to go with a new vendor, I would say we stick with Subway for 14 of the Fridays, Pizza for 14 of the Fridays and have the new vendor do the remaining 5 Fridays.
- Something to note is that Parent Council makes between \$600-\$650 per pizza day and between \$250 - \$300 per Subway day. Our profit is much better on the Pizza than it is on the Subway order and we have about 100 more pizza orders than Subway orders. The margins (if approved) on the new vendors would be similar to the Subway margins.
- The Lunch Lady does offer a wide variety of menu items including pasta, grilled cheese, perogies, burgers, tacos and pancakes. I have reached out to her to see

if she wants a bit more exposure in the letter that goes out to parents at the start of the year as I'm not sure the amount of orders she gets. Based on some comments voiced at the last council meeting, I checked the Alberta Health Services records for the kitchen and there were no violations. The franchise that serves our school did change over the last couple of years. Parent Council doesn't make much on these lunches but it does give parents some options.

- Thoughts on the direction to take next year regarding Friday lunches? I do need to firm up the dates with Little Caesars and Subway as they give our school priority.

8. Yearbook Committee Brenda Renowden

- Last day to order yearbooks is May 31st. Rachel has had this information in the monthly newsletter for the last two months, so I think everyone has had what they needed to order one if they want.
- The yearbook cover contest was completed. We had a large amount of submissions and Mrs. Adams had selected the winners. Also thank you Mrs. Adams for assisting us in getting pictures from the teachers.
- Current members, Lee-Ann, Michelle and Tara have indicated they are willing to help out again next year. It looks like the chair will be filled with either Lee-Ann or Chris Kelly. They are working that out.
- I will be moving at the end of May. However, I intend to honour my commitment. All of us in the committee will continue to complete the book (which is progressing on schedule). I will make the final submission to Lifetouch remotely, and even though it will be summer, I will email council to tell them it has been done.

10. Long-Term Planning Committee Frankie-Lou Nelligan

- The Indoor Planting program is growing in both the literal and figurative sense! There are currently 4 grade 4 teachers who have incorporated the indoor planting beds into their science program this year. Madame Leptich and Monsieur Vallee planted their cucumbers, lettuce and beans almost a month ago and these plants will be ready to transplant soon. Mrs. Mazerolle and Mrs. Sather's classes planted

yesterday and should be able to harvest prior to the school's end. Planting with the students has been the highlight of my month and we have discussed everything from germination, energy conversion and how full spectrum light works.

- Madame Szilagyi has also decided to take on a planting program with "Tomato Spheres". Her students are going to be planting tomato seeds that have been sent to the international space station along in a controlled experiment with normal tomato seeds. Lots of learning going on for everyone involved and I hope everyone will take an opportunity to check out our new little farmers in action.
