Enrolment numbers

RVS current student enrolment is at 22,712 students, a 5.3% increase of 1145 students over last year. Significant growth was in all of the major RVS municipalities. Airdrie grew by 5.7%. Cochrane grew by 8%. Chestermere grew by 6.6%.

Ward Tours

Ward Boundary Review

In preparation for the 2017 municipal elections the RVS Board of Trustees is conducting a ward boundary review. The boundaries need to be official 6 months prior to the election. A number of recommendations will be put forward and will be shared via power point at November/early December school council meetings.

On Oct. 18 Alberta Education launched an online curriculum survey to allow input from all Albertans. The survey is open until November 18 and can be found on the Alberta Education website. 2016 Satisfaction & Student Success Reported

RVS' Annual Accountability Report on Satisfaction Survey, Student Achievement Results and Trends were presented to the Board, Oct. 20. The report highlighted high degrees of satisfaction among parents and staff, but highlighted student engagement as an area for investigation. In relation to provincial tests, RVS students remain on par with their provincial counterparts, but are under represented at the acceptable and standard of excellence in a few areas at Grades 6 and 9. The good news is most students' academic results climb dramatically at the high school level as witness by diploma exams marks. Read the full on the RVS website.

Carbon Tax

School boards and schools have supported environmental stewardship for many years. Although they still support many aspects of the Climate Change Initiative. School Boards have asked the provincial government for an exemption or rebate on the carbon Tax. For some boards this tax could mean additional transportation finance pressures. This tax would impact transportation and infrastructure
