### **Ward Tours**

Trustees will be touring their ward schools with the new superintendent Greg Luterbach. Mr. Luterbach and I will be touring the Springbank and Bragg Creek area schools on November 1.

### Ward Boundary Review

In preparation for the 2017 municipal elections the RVS Board of Trustees is conducting a ward boundary review. The boundaries need to be official 6 months prior to the election. A number of recommendations will be put forward and there will be a YouTube video created for the November School Council Meetings. There will be opportunities for public consultations probably in November and December. The outcome of the ward boundary review could have impact on Ward 4 so stay tuned!

### ASCA (Alberta School Councils Association)

The deadline for school councils to submit resolutions to be brought forward to annual conference in April is December 12.

### Changes to Grade 6 PAT's Math

Minister Eggen announced that there will be a 15 minute math facts section added. No calculators allowed.

### **Education Act**

Waiting to hear about consultations mentioned on Alberta Education Website for fall 2016. The current School Act has been extended until August 2018.

### **Bill C241**

School boards across Canada have been working with MP Waugh from Saskatchewan to pass a Bill allowing 100% GST rebate for school boards. Right now boards only receive 68%. We would encourage community members to encourage their MP's to support the Bill.

### Carbon Tax

School Boards have asked the provincial government for an exemption on the carbon Tax. For some boards this tax could mean additional transportation finance pressures. This tax would impact transportation and infrastructure

### **Curriculum Update**

Alberta Education is conducting a complete review of curriculum over the next 5 years. K-4 to be completed by 2018. Grades 5 -8 by 2019. Grades 9-12 by 2020 (12). Opportunities for consultation have been indicated.

Rocky View Board Meetings are on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of every month and are open to the public.
