2. <u>Principal's Report</u> Celia Barrington

- 1. A great start to our school year. We have 596 students enrolled with a class size average of 22.9. Similar to last year in French Immersion, we used all of our carryover to lower the Gr.3 English classes from 29 to 22 by adding a class.
- 2. We are delighted to welcome one new teacher, Mrs. Erin Sather and a new caretaker, Mr. Sandy Menendos.
- 3. Hosting the Open House the afternoon before 1st day was a great success and received very favourable reviews from parents. Thank you to School council for hosting a Coffee and Kleenex for parents on the first 2 days.
- 4. Our entire staff was recertified in Emergency 1st Aid on August 28. This is a practice that we do every 3 years to ensure that we keep current.
- 5. As written in our first newsletter, Literacy is a very strong focus for our school again this year with several initiatives underway.
- 6. September is a busy month with Terry Fox, Photo Day, Sports Day and In Line Skating planned and ready to go.
- 7. Looking at having a mental health day to support students.
- 8. School Budget presentation
 - 10 teachers will attend a vulnerable readers conference and then present their learning to the staff.

- Learning Commons – will present in the future as to their plans and directions. Possible funding needed.

9. Student Learning Assessment (SLA) – 2 components this year. Digital application and performance task (pencil and paper) for writing, literacy and numeracy.

- Pilot project – information will only be presented to parents of children who have completed.
