2. Administration Report

- Election will be coming up. Remember there has been a boundary change, please keep informed and vote
- Professional Learning start up this year went very well
- Transition planning was done with students who required extra support in the spring
- First day lists went well. Very pleased with the feedback and how the day went
- Professional learning time prior to students return was looking at classroom profiles and looking at diversity of the classrooms and support they may need.
- Staff learned a new dance to do for the kids on the first day of school. Teachers had a lot of fun! Students will learn the dance for the next assembly
- Terry Fox run is next Friday families are welcome
- Next steps for the school:
- Makers space is starting to come together and we look forward to continuing to grow the_space
- Playground resurfacing is coming up
- Robots and iPads are something the school is interested in purchasing
- Priorities for the school are: Maker space, transforming the Learning Commons - this is our schools year for funding to support this, at this time will not need school council to fund this
- Books arrived the last day of school. They have been stamped and catalogued. The focus was on grade 1 home reading and each year we would like to improve the reading material in the next grade
- Teacher collaborative space - still needs to be painted. Room will be dedicated to Helen Clease
- Lions club donated money last year and that money was used for robotics, lego
- Financial proposal has been put forward to school council to cover school expenses examples: lacrosse, robotics, books, residencies
- Swimming - varying responses on the swimming program. The school had several problems with the swimming program. 1) Issue with getting enough volunteers 2) Some students lacked interest in the programs 3)Program is not a lesson program but a "swim to survive" 4) Loss of learning time
- If parents would like swimming to continue with this program Lindsay is suggesting to have it focused to one grade. West side may be able to offer lessons if we have less students participating
- Proposal to explore a swim to survive program to see if it is offered at Westside
- Workshops for parents - last year we offered, You are Strong in two separate sessions. This workshop focused on friendship. It was very successful and received great feedback
- Parents would like more workshops. The high school, junior high and elementary. Ideas for other workshops - Internet safety, Screenagers, math, literacy night, behavioural needs, trustee debate (Michelle and Brandi will have to look into that, schools cannot be involved) learning styles, anxiety, test taking, cultural awareness (international day). There are grants available for these events
- Playground resurfacing has to happen this spring for one of our playgrounds. The current quote is $\$ 76,000$ for the same surfacing, pea gravel as an alternative was approx $\$ 42,000$. There are grants available for this. Should we look at pea gravel to stop the cycle of having to resurface every 10 years?

3. Treasurer's Report Katie Mayer

- We were left with approx. \$30,000 from last year
- FEEVES has approximately $\$ 10,000$
- Have given the kindergarten teachers the same amount of money as the other grade teams this year
- Council will not pay for bussing this year, it will be paid for by parents
