Last meeting was three weeks ago. We have an entirely new parent council. We are feeling really invigorated.

President report: looking for council interest

Principal Report/ Assistant Principal Report:

- -sitting down with the co-chairs
- -Rockyview trend collecting more data/provincial as well
- -grade 1-9 students across RVS will be part of some diagnostic baseline data
- -grade 1 will be in January
- -Grade 2/3/4 the deadline was October 7th
- -Admin/Learning support have been supporting getting that in
- -entering data
- -showed Cayley a screenshot to show what some of our data looks like
- -we will be using this data to inform our instruction
- -tough job for teachers but we are supporting them to use that data and to work with kids
- -lots of fun making memes to start
- -we will be coming back together with Elizabeth Barrett in March to continue this work
- -general feeling was that teachers wanted to get to know kids rather than jump on assessment
- -great baseline for academic understanding of students
- -intent was good.
- -this was not attached to finances like it was last year.
- -teachers knew the assessments a bit more
- -elementary students are data poor
- -teachers know their students/they don't necessarily need an assessment
- -each student took this test
- -teachers will see by the students/class
- -admin can see the entire school via grade level

- -was this shared with parents? No, it was not shared with students
- -we will need to do a bit of work with teachers how to share with parents
- -some of these assessments are province wide
- -province picked the tool they may not have been something we choose
- -timeline was tight
- -report cards can be challenging for parents to navigate
- -we will continue to share this out as messaging

-WORKBOOK:

- -we look at our own data
- -we don't have a ton
- -Alberta Education Assurance Measures
- -generally, we are doing well
- -lag data
- -parental involvement was down
- -we could easily point to covid
- -Parent council- how do we welcome parents back in the building
- -19 parents responded to the survey
- -Rockyview has a survey as well
- -Brendan is combing through the data
- -these tend to be quite a bit higher than Rockyview
- -comparing to elementary schools is challenging
- -this helps us to understand our community
- -Brendan put out a form to help us to understand what we are doing well
- -offering opportunity to offer us feedback

-How do we get parents to read the OWL outlook?

- -2 clicks max
- -SMS sends theirs out Sunday
- -Agenda are being used well
- -print out the document?
- -links are in the outlook
- -presents well
- -send out time to Sunday?

-Literacy and Numeracy Games

- -work is steeped in literacy/numeracy
- -we are doing a block of numeracy games for a bit after lunch
- -getting in number reps
- -sneaky numeracy
- -having fun and learning at the same time
- -infusing First Nation indigenous learning
- -PBIS: positive behaviour
- -we are making this very visible in our building

- -it really supports us to have the same language
- -we have tied the character focuses in to the PBIS pillars
- -This is a rockyview structure
- -PBIS is present in what we do

Parent comment: In one of my daughters 'classes, there is a little boy that is struggling. The teacher spoke to the kids about his brain and how it works. Created some amazing empathy.

Trustee Report:

- -apologies for missing last meeting
- -rockyview's mandate for maintaining schools
- -much of this happens over the summer
- -SMS renovated cafeteria to auxiliary learning space
- -Lagoon is finally finished
- -Municipal land
- -springbank high school renovated the foods room
- -a lot of schools along the division have had upgrades
- -new floors at Elbow Valley
- -all schools are modernized
- -municipal reserves agreement
- -the former council has disconnected that
- -if there was land available, ½ the money went to schools/½ went to the county
- -we are working to renegotiate that agreement
- -springbank schools are county schools
- -many school have been renovated with those funds
- -space for students
- -from 2001-2021 we have huge population increase
- -we have 91% more students from 2001-2021
- -we have had to reconfigure schools to support student growth
- -students are being bused across town
- -we are at the point if we don't build some schools by 2026 we will have 500 students without spaces
- -1/3 of our students are in portable classrooms
- -we add portables when we have need
- -stresses the other spaces (gym/music)
- -every year we identify the need for a school
- -we look at the new communities coming
- -the schools are not necessarily part of it
- -we work with them to say we need a school
- -all services have to be in for the school to be developed
- -Harmony: The developer said he would build a school. He is getting the "site" ready

- -this process can take 10 plus years
- -the school needs to be approved by the province
- -RVS puts in our top priority
- -we are always competing against infrastructure
- -4 years out before it can be occupied
- -reconfiguration? Would you consider bringing grade 5's down to Elbow Valley
- -we are seeing growth out here
- -as we look at SMS and look at the space that they don't have, and if we have space we will consider reconfiguration
- -all spaces will be created to a learning space
- -we have 2 online schools in Rockyview Schools
- -during covid many parents choose that
- -those numbers have dropped a little bit. The elementary school has dropped significantly
- -Building Futures- Building houses
- -Farm School- students going to school on the farm
- -Learning connection schools- these are not traditional schools
- -without those extra learning spaces what would our schools look like
- -parents can lobby for schools
- -we will need your voice
- -we have met with the minister of education to plead our case
- -every portable move 250 thousand dollars
- -thank you for the wonderful barbeque
- -those events are great ways to encourage parents to participate
- -this is what school should be about
- -one school returning to us: Holy Family School in Cochrane
- -catholic school took our school and they are giving it back to us
- -we are looking into how much money to spend on this
- -strategic plan- email asking for input
- -it was interesting to me how many kids asked for a quiet learning space
- -most of the parents talked about safe and caring schools
- -stick to the core: reading/writing/math
- -goals have just gone out
- -CPF meeting- Judi will be chairing this until we can find a chair
- -BC- French Immersion Certificate when graduating
- -Rockyview Schools can't do that
- -we don't have the numbers in French Immersion
- -we need to increase the numbers in High school
- -options cause challenges for kids
- -DELF exam is available for French Immersion kids
- -\$200 test
- -DELF B- world standard for French
- -RVS is looking to supporting that
- -How do we as a division try to keep the kids in French?
- -How do we recognize them in French?

- -CPF- doesn't have a good relationship with Alberta Education
- -CPF doesn't have a chapter in Airdrie
- -Faculty St-Jean is our home place for FI teachers
- -Northern Alberta is better off as they have Francophone communities
- -How do we support our teachers when they come?
- -There is a cost to our French Programs, Judi spoke about this to the board
- -there are lot of additional costs
- -have we considered late Immersion?
